The Family Justice Center Alliance is a program of Alliance for HOPE International, which provides training and technical assistance to developing and open Family Justice/Multi-Agency Centers.

The Alliance also provides specialized technical assistance, training, and strategic planning through consulting contracts including Study Tours, Strategic Planning, Specialized Technical Assistance, and Snapshots.

STUDY TOUR Activities include a community assessment to help us get to know you, your community partners, and your key stakeholders. The Study Tour also provides an opportunity to support Center planning by developing steering committees, obtaining community buy-in, and collecting baseline data about current services to support the development of your Family Justice Center. Our recommendations for the next steps in creating your Family Justice Center are then presented to you in a report to be shared with your planning team and others.



STRATEGIC PLANNING The Family Justice Center Alliance team conducts a two-day event using a Dimensional Strategies format to help your community dream big and set collective goals and vision for your Family Justice Center. Outcomes from this event are compiled into a formal Strategic Planning Report that becomes the blueprint for the creation of your Center.



SPECIALIZED TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE The Family Justice Center Alliance Team provides six (6) months of virtual follow-up technical assistance via webinars, and conference/video calls as requested to support the development of the Center. This may include progress reviews, identification of resources, or specific training, to name a few.



SNAPSHOT An opportunity for operating Family Justice Centers to reassess current services and operations to support the Center's continued growth and expansion. The Family Justice Center Alliance team hosts a community presentation on the EJC framework to lay the groundwork for further dreaming and planning, and then spends two (2) days meeting with Center staff, partners, survivors, and community members in order to assess what is working well and identify gaps. The result is a report that identifies strengths, areas for further growth, and recommendations for next steps.
